Dear HLWM friends

We have good news for you: Joseph and Geetha Komanapalli with their daughter Kamal will visit the Netherlands! The leaders of HLWM India will be our guests from April 27th until May 12th. A wonderful possibility for everyone to get to know them. Several preaching engagements and information evenings are planned and we gladly recommend to attend the Benefit Dinner in IJsselstein, Netherlands, on May 8th, which is organised by pastor Hans Tims in IJsselstein, board member HLWM and director of "He Lives Mission". Kamal Komanapalli will sing beautiful Indian songs and the proceeds of that night will be for the work in India.

We are grateful that the annual visit to HLWM's mission field near the coast of the Gulf of Bengal went very well. All members of the team returned in good health, with lots of memories.

One of the members even wrote a 43 pages journal about all activities. You'll find two short reports in this newsletter by Henk and Anneke Crezee. Also from Rosanne Boeve (19 years young) who visited India for the first time.

Construction of the vocational school is getting on well. The building is finished and now the electrical installation and plastering of walls and ceilings is going on.

Emergency help for the persecuted Christians in Orissa is going on full speed. Joseph with some helpers have visited that area twice. They were able to provide real



aid and actual relief. Main necessities like blankets, clothing, pots and pans, food, medicine and tents were given to many refugees. Joseph was shocked by all the misery he saw in the refugee camps. He had not expected to hear such sad stories, neither to see the awful devastation in the villages where Christians lived.

The situation is still not safe and refugees live in fear hidden in the woods, under very primitive circumstances.

Right now elections are going on in the various Indian states. Threatening situations occur in connection with political meetings and rallies when fanatical Hindu supporters go out on campaigns where alcohol flows abundantly. Christians are then often attacked. Joseph and his evangelists have taken measures to protect our buildings and compounds.

We request you to pray for the persecuted Christians, also for peace and safety in HLWM's mission area. Please pray also for wisdom and health for all our local co-workers.

In India we were joined by the German delegation Manfred and Sigrid Schwartz, Peter and Susan Jacobus, and the English couple Geoff and Marion Elliott. After hearty greetings we all thanked the Lord for protection during the long journey. It was long after midnight when we went to bed. During the next two days we visited the two children homes with a total of 160 children, the primary and high school, the Bible school, medical centres and the Pathupadu church where we conducted a short service.

Dedication of the new vocational school took place on February 20th. This school was built on HLWM's large compound in Saripalli, next to the new children home which was dedicated last year, and a new church which is still under construction.

This time the Annual Gospel Healing Conventions were held in Saripalli, very close to the mission house. For a change, as in all the years before we went to Kalipatnam which took us 2 hours of travelling each day. Again the 3 days of conventions were a great blessing to all. Many Indians heard the Gospel and accepted Jesus into their heart. People were healed, encouraged, they learned new songs and experienced God's protection and His great love.

In Mollaparru Village we took part in the foundation stone ceremony for a new church and visited the Matlam church congregation. Highlight was the baptism of 24 people in de Gulf of Bengal. Another highlight was the first stone ceremony for a Prayer Centre in Perupalem, where in future strong prayers will be sent up to heaven 24 hours daily. This meeting ended up with a delicious Indian meal in the open air.

Jesus gave us His mission command in Math. 28: 18-20

"All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you; and lo, I am with you always, to the close of the age".

We thank our heavenly Father, that again we had the privilege to work for His Kingdom in India.

We thank you for your prayers, they were of great value. We thank pastor Hans Tims for giving wonderful messages.

In one word: Fan-tas-tic

I was elated to be allowed to join an international team on a mission trip to India. It was an exciting and wonderful experience. We had a fantastic time together and I got a first hand impression of how the local people live. On the first day we were welcomed by the children of the Saripalli children home saluting loudly: good morning sirs, good morning madams, all the time with their little arms crossed. Looking beautiful in their school uniforms, they presented us with garlands as an act of welcome. They were glad to see us.

The second day we visited the HLWM health centre where we fed old and sick woman. And I thought of Matthew 25 verse 35: I was hungry and you gave me food.

The "Healing Conventions" in Saripalli were also a terrific experience. Mind you: two services of 3 to 4 hours daily. This goes for three days with a lot of singing, frequent shouts of "Halleluja", long prayers, long sermons. Up to 2000 women and children come to listen, but not so many men. Nobody is weary. They are eager to hear the word of God. And expect healings. Indian people expect from the messages more than we in Europe. And afterwards they all want to be blessed individually and to be prayed for. During the week we laid also the foundation stone for a little church in Mollaparru village.

Afterwards we walked through the streets and knocked on doors, distributing bibles.

I took part also in the foundation stone ceremony for a "Prayer Tower Centre" in Perupalem. And I experienced another special event. Twenty-four Indian people were baptized in the sea to give witness of their faith to follow Jesus.

The last night was reserved for testimonies which the bible women heard from visitors to the conventions among which were many exciting accounts of healings.

It was a terrific experience to be part of this outreach for which I want to thank Hermon Living Water Ministries, but foremost our heavenly Father for giving me a perspective for my own life in future.

I am a member of the Navigators Student Society.

Their view is to know Jesus and to tell other people about Him. This became now a reality for me thanks to this trip. I do admire the directors of HLWM: Rev. Joseph and Rev. Geetha Komanapalli very much for all the work they are doing among the outcast Indian Dalits.
